

Fellowship Diploma (FCBE) Overview

The Fellowship Diploma is the highest and most prestigious level offered and will demand from the candidate a most mature understanding of the musical style, with masterful control of technique for demanding repertoire. Repertoire for this level will be similar to what is suitable for a postgraduate music recital, such as a Master's or Doctoral Degree. Highly advanced concerti, grand sonatas, virtuosic showpieces and very complex works of a demanding nature are the works that will be explored.

The Fellowship can be undertaken in any instrument available for examination.

It is expected that a performance at this level represents the following characteristics:

- Projecting a professional presence, including attention to posture, stage presence, and adherence to standard performance conventions.
- Achieving excellence in all aspects, which encompasses technical proficiency, musical development, comprehension of various styles, and displaying a polished professional stage presence.
- Recognising and executing appropriate performance conventions and styles for each work, showcasing a diverse range of musical knowledge.
- Demonstrating an understanding of the structure, musical content, and defining characteristics of each work, while delivering a cohesive concept during performance.
- Exhibiting technical mastery and stylistic awareness, resulting in a compelling and unified performance.
- Maintaining unity and continuity in multi-movement works through skilful transitions and a cohesive interpretation.
- Possessing a command of contemporary techniques relevant to the instrument being played.
- Displaying proficiency and ensemble cohesion when performing accompanying parts, while consistently integrating with the soloist's performance.

To qualify for a Fellowship award, the candidate must display the above characteristics to an outstanding degree.
